VETERANS AFFAIRS Massachusetts Knights of Columbus

Both the State Deputy and the Master Fourth Degree support Veteran Affairs. They encourage Grand Knights, Navigators, Officers and everyone to become involved.

Knights of Columbus members have a history of supporting our U.S. Armed Forces and Veterans. This has been done in varied methods.

Request each Grand Knight annually appoint a Veterans Affairs Chairman. Notify the State Chairman Veteran Affairs as to the name, address, telephone number, Council name and number once the council chairman is appointed.

The chairman does not have to be a veteran. Activities and volunteers are not limited to Knights of Columbus members. Family members can be involved. When volunteering at a veteran facility remind our personnel they need to inform the facility volunteer coordinator that they are associated with the Knights of Columbus. The Knights of Columbus identification number is 156.

Provided for your current consideration and adoption are a few suggestions as to how you can become involved in supporting our Veterans and active duty personnel. This support and involvement is not limited to the Fourth degree. It includes all members, family and friends of the Knights of Columbus (see attached).

These suggestions are in addition to other Knights of Columbus programs such as Wreaths Across America, Fisher House, Flag Day, etc.

In Massachusetts the Veterans Affairs Volunteer Service program has been expanded to include the U.S. Veterans Affairs Massachusetts National Cemetery located in Bourne, MA. Volunteers are needed Monday thru Friday during cemetery operating hours. Volunteers are needed to be in the reception center to assist visitors in obtaining a named veteran gravesite number and providing a cemetery road map to proceed to a gravesite. In addition volunteers are needed outdoor to assist and augment cemetery staff in the coordination and placement of many funeral processions upon their arrival. You can volunteer for a few hours, one day or multiple days. Each volunteer usage is pre-planned.

Enclosure one is a listing of facilities and point of contact. Some suggestions are contained in the second enclosure. Please encourage personnel in the area to consider an assignment.

If a council has insufficient resources, consideration should be given to have a joint venture with local veteran groups.

Patient facility—After coordination with K of C Point of Contact

Escort patients to Mass

Active Duty personnel

Offer assistance to family member while spouse is deployed: i.e., handy man

Provide family member with prepaid telephone calling card for use by deployed service member.

Council—Armed Forces Recognition certificate 1471 for presentation to Brother Knight on active duty.

Consider sending to member's unit Commander a letter requesting the Command make a presentation at appropriate formation. Also include on transmittal letter Knights of Columbus appreciation and compliment to all serving in the unit.

Assembly—Patriotic Service Award #839 for presentation to Knights of Columbus member as well as non-member for patriotic support.
